### **Josh Michaud, PhD, MHS, MA**

Dr. Michaud is an Associate Director for Global Health Policy at the Kaiser Family Foundation. He is also a Professorial Lecturer at the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) in Washington D.C. Prior to his work at Kaiser and SAIS, Dr. Michaud was as an infectious disease epidemiologist with the U.S. Department of Defense, and the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He holds a Ph.D. in International Health Policy from Johns Hopkins SAIS, an M.A. in Applied Economics from Johns Hopkins University, and an M.H.S. in Infectious Disease Epidemiology from the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health.

### **Kyle Petersen, DO, FIDSA, FACP**

Dr. Petersen is an Infectious Disease specialist and joined Peace Corps in 2018. He received his Bachelor of Science in Biotechnology from Worcester Polytechnic Institute and his medical degree from Des Moines University-College of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Petersen is board certified in Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases, is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, the Infectious Disease Society of America and is Certified in Travel Health by the International Society of Travel Medicine. He is an Associate Professor of medicine at Uniformed Services University, Bethesda MD. Dr. Petersen is a military decorated retired Captain from the U.S. Navy, with special interest in hyperbaric medicine.

### **Melody Butler, BSN, RN, CIC**

Melody Butler is the founder and Executive Director of Nurses Who Vaccinate. She started this organization in 2011 to provide nurses and healthcare providers a designated environment for evidence-based immunization information, news updates and action alerts. An active educator and advocate in the current measles outbreak in the greater NYC area, Ms. Butler is also employed as a nurse in Infection Control at Good Samaritan Hospital Medical Center in West Islip, NY. Since 2017, she has been a committee member of the National Vaccine Advisory Committee-NVAC. Ms.

Butler also serves as an advocate for the UN Foundation's Shot@Life campaign.

### **Professor Peter L Chiodini OBE BSc MB PhD MRCS FRCP (Lond) FRCP (Glasg) FRCPATH FFTM RCPS (Glasg), ESCMID Fellow**

Professor Chiodini is Consultant Parasitologist at the Hospital for Tropical Diseases, Honorary Professor at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, Honorary Clinical Professor at University College London and Director of the Public Health England (PHE) Malaria Reference Laboratory and the PHE Parasitology Reference Laboratory. He graduated from King's College London with First Class Honours in Zoology and gained his PhD in Parasitology at the Wellcome Research Laboratories. He was Dean of the Faculty of Travel Medicine of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (2009 to 2012). He is also a practicing clinician at the Hospital for Tropical Diseases, with special interests in malaria and hydatid disease. His research interests include new diagnostic methods for parasitic infections, malaria, Chagas disease and hydatid disease. In 2018 he was awarded an OBE for services to parasitology and malaria.

### **Jane Chiodini, MSc, RGN, RM, FFTM, RCPS (Glasg) QN**

Ms. Chiodini was the first nurse in England to obtain the MSc degree in travel medicine. She is a leading figure in the UK in this field of practice, was Chair of the RCN Travel Health Forum 2000 – 2006 and lead author on the RCN guidance: Travel health nursing, career and competence development. She was Director of Education of the Faculty of Travel Medicine at the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons, Glasgow and in October 2018 she became Dean of the Faculty of Travel Medicine, the first woman and first nurse to do so. Jane has served as NPG Chair and was the first recipient of the ISTM Distinguished Nurse Leadership Award. Jane continues to operate a travel clinic in London. She started training healthcare professionals 18 years ago and is passionate about teaching and developing tools for healthcare professionals to use in a travel consultation.

**Julie Richards, NP, MS, MSN, FNP-BC, WHNP-BC, CTH®**

Julie Richards leads travel health at the Vaden Health Center at Stanford University. She is Past President of ATHNA and serves on the Board of Directors. She also serves in a leadership role in the International Society of Travel Medicine. She consults regarding travel health issues and conducts regular training for medical professionals and lay audiences. She is a former faculty member of the UCSF School of Nursing where she taught in the Women's Primary Care Nurse Practitioner Program. She earned a Master of Science degree in engineering from the University of Illinois and a Master of Science degree in nursing at the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston. She is a licensed nurse practitioner, board certified in family practice and women's health; and holds a certificate in travel health from the International Society of Travel Medicine.

**Gail Rosselot, NP, MS, MPH, FFTM RCPS (Glasg), FAANP, FISTM, CTH®**

Ms. Rosselot has maintained a private NP travel health practice since 1992 and has been the director of The Westchester Course since 2002 training more than 5000 health professionals in travel health fundamentals. She is a founding member of ATHNA and its current President. Presently, she also chairs the working group seeking ANA recognition for travel health nursing as an official U.S. specialty. Ms. Rosselot is a founding member of ISTM, served as NPG Chair, and was the second recipient of the ISTM Distinguished Nurse Leadership Award in 2017. She is an author of two sections in the CDC Yellow Book and a co-author of chapters in the Keystone and Jong travel medicine texts.

**Claire Wong, MSc, RN, FFTM, RCPS (Glasg), FISTM, CTH®**

Claire Wong started her career in travel health nursing at the British Airways Travel Clinic in London in 1996. Since that time she has held several travel health clinical and management positions, most notably as a Specialist Nurse, 2002-2013, with the National Travel Health Network and Centre (NaTHNc) London and Liverpool, UK. In 2013, Claire relocated to New Zealand and has since worked at the offices of Worldwise Travellers Health Centres. She has been very active in ISTM serving on various committees; this year she completes her four year term as Counselor on the ISTM Executive Board. Claire is also a Clinical Lecturer at Otago University, has published on a variety of travel health topics, and is a regular presenter at international travel medicine conferences.
